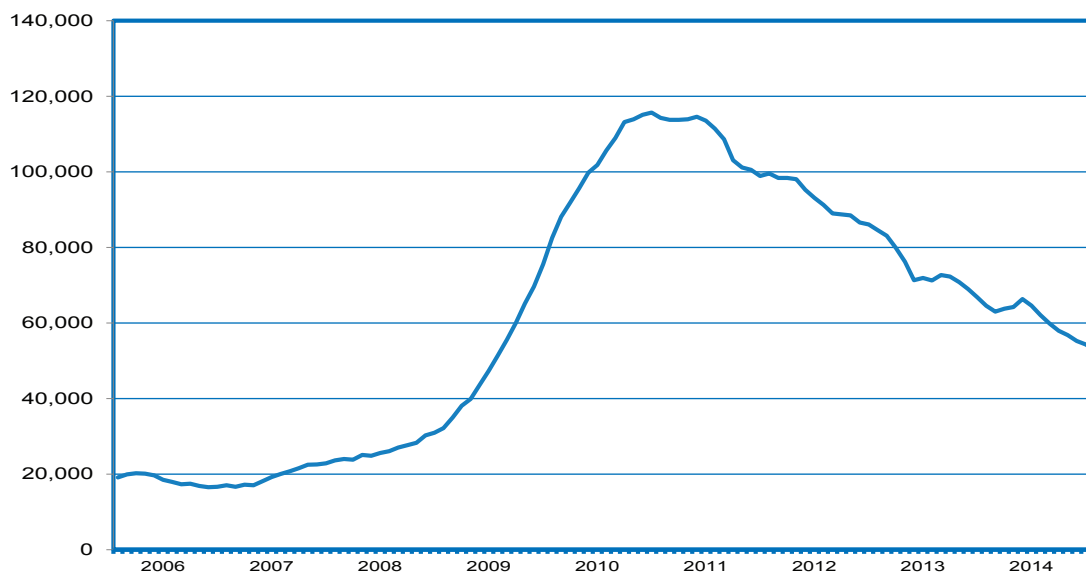


Job Losers in Nevada

State Sees Steady Decline in Job Losers Job "Losers" in Nevada (12-month moving average)



- According to the latest data from the Current Population Survey, more than 52,000 of Nevada's unemployed are persons classified as job losers (individuals who involuntarily lost their last job- compared to those who left their jobs willingly or completing temporary contracts).
- At its peak in July 2010, Nevada had 115,700 annual average job losers. Since that time the State has seen a steady decline in the number of job losers with current figures coming in at 52,800 for the 12 month period ending in August 2014- less than half its peak. This represents a decline of 62,900 people.
- At its lowest point in the last decade (June 2006), there were only 16,500 job losers reported in Nevada. At that point in time, job losers represented only 31 percent of the total unemployed. In August 2014, the ratio of job losers is nearly 45 percent.
- Job losers have declined by 11.8 percent since last year. All major racial categories have seen declines in the past 4 month. Both male and female unemployed have seen steady declines since Dec 2010. Men have a higher level of job loser status at 36,600 vs 26,600 women experienced in August state wide.
