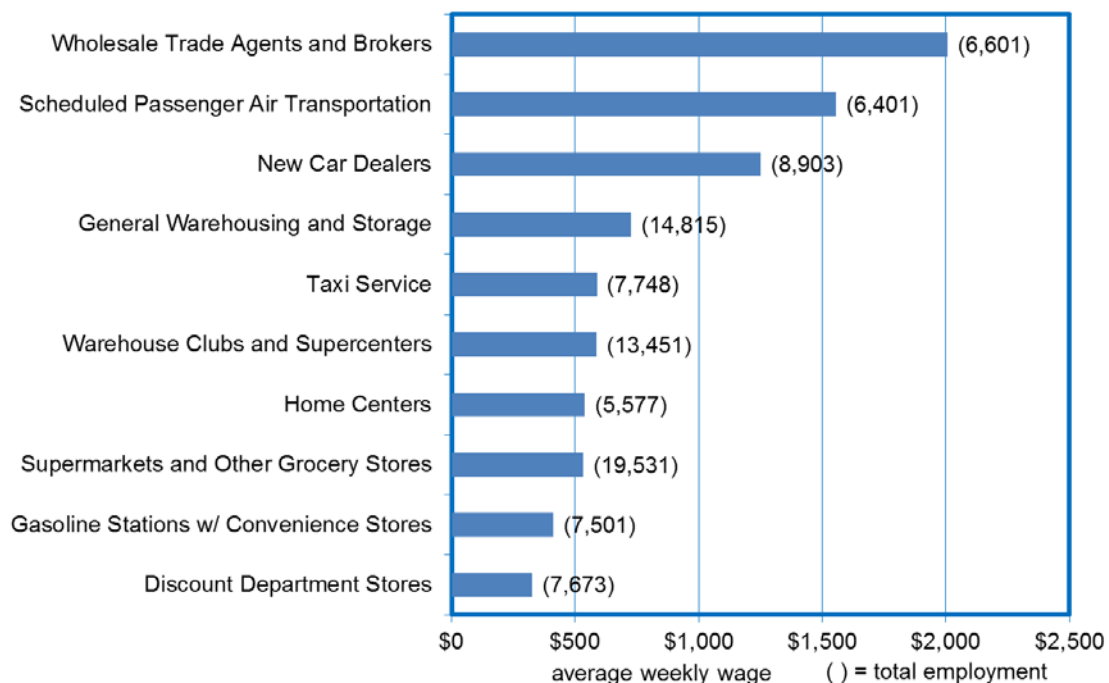

Trade, Transportation, and Utilities Sector has Wide Array of Wages



- In the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) Program, the Research and Analysis Bureau collects and compiles employment and wage data for workers covered by Nevada unemployment insurance laws, and federal civilian workers covered by Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees.
- Trade, transportation, and utilities is a group of industries comprised of utilities, wholesale trade, retail trade, and transportation/warehousing. Given the variety of industries within the sector, there is considerable variation in wages.
- During 2016:IIQ, wholesale trade agents and brokers and scheduled air transportation paid the highest average weekly wages at \$2,010 and \$1,560, respectively.
- Discount department stores and gasoline stations with convenience stores paying the lowest at \$325 and \$410 respectively.
- Super markets and wholesale clubs are the largest employers in the sector. Both pay wages of between \$500 and \$600 per week, on average.
