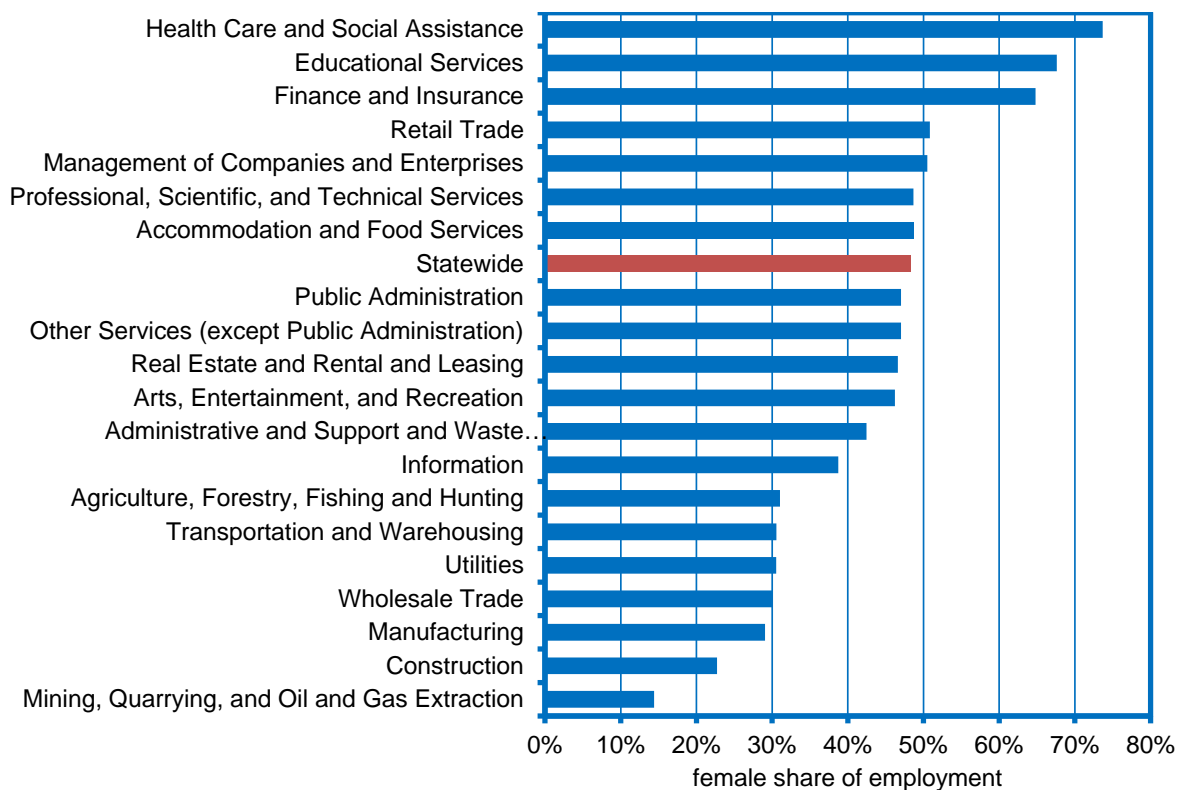

Female Employment Varies by Industry Sector; Large Shares in Health Care and Education; Relatively Small Shares in Construction and Mining



- With data from the Census Bureau's Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics Program (LED), we are able to assess Nevada employment trends by gender, including those for the female workforce. This *Research Note* examines the female share of employment by industry supersector.
- Statewide, women account for 48.3% of all employment. There are nearly 600,000 female workers in Nevada.
- The highest rates of female employment are found in health care, education, and finance/insurance. The share of employment accounted for by females in these industries ranges from 74% to 65%.
- Fewer women are found in industries such as mining, construction, and manufacturing, where they account for less than 30% of total employment.
