

Nevada's Male-Female Wage Gap (Average Monthly Earnings; 2014 Data Through IIIQ)



- With data from the Census Bureau's Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics Program, we are able to assess movements in the male-female wage gap.
- Over the past ten years, males have averaged between \$4,000 and \$4,300 in monthly earnings in Nevada. Females averaged between \$2,800 and \$3,100.
- When we consider female wages as a percent of male wages, the gap becomes much more clear.
- Between 2005 and 2008, female monthly earnings were approximately 69% of their male counterparts.
- However, the gap has been shrinking. According to data through the third quarter of 2014, women are earning 73% of what males earn in a given month.
