# **Leisure and Hospitaly Industry in Nevada**

### **Executive Summary**

The leisure and hospitality industry sector includes a broad category of fields within the service industry such as lodging, food services, event planning, theme parks, transportation and other tourism oriented products and services. Two primary industry sub groups comprise this industry; Arts, entertainment, and recreation (NAICS 71) and Accommodation and Food Services (NAICS 72).

The leisure and hospitality industry has long been of great importance to Nevada's economy. From 2015 to 2019, the average share of total private employment attributed to Leisure and Hospitality was 29.7 percent. In the Las Vegas-Paradise metro, this percentage was 33.3 percent.

All industries in Nevada and the United States were adversely affected by the Covid-19 pandemic of 2020. However, the Leisure and Hospitality industry was the most impacted in Nevada. From first quarter of 2020 to second quarter of 2020, this industry would lose almost 167,000 jobs or 47.8 percent of existing employment in that industry. In Clark County, the loss to this industry was 144,340 jobs or 49.5 percent.

The following report looks at projected changes in employment and the most common occupations in this industry over the period 2020 to 2030. It is projected to grow a relatively high rate of 35.8 percent over the ten years or 91,591 jobs. Among the other 23 major industries this ranks first in absolute number of jobs gained. The majority of this growth is going to occur in Accommodations (NAICS 721). However, the relative share of total employment tied to leisure and hospitality is predicted to decline. This tells of the state's employment offerings diversifying a bit over that ten year span.

The occupations that are going to see the greatest employment; Cooks, waiters/waitresses, fast food/counter workers, are largely in the food service industry. These coincidentally are some of the lower paying occupations.





### **Impacts of Covid-19 Pandemic**

The following table illustrates how the pandemic affected the various industries (defined at the two-digit NAICS level). Covid impact is the employment in the respective industry for first quarter of 2020 minus the employment for second quarter of 2020. Recovery is the employment as of first quarter of 2022 minus that of first quarter of 2022. This measures how much the industry have left to recover in order to be at the same employment level that they were in first quarter of 2020.

The losses in Leisure and Hospitality (NAICS 71 and 72 combined) were 6.8 times as much as the next most impacted industry, Administrative and Waste Services. While the job growth in this industry recently has been quite robust, it still has just over 34,000 left for it to be back at the pre-pandmeic level.

### **Projected Growth in Leisure and Hospitality**

For the period, 2020 to 2030, Leisure and Hospitality (defined as the combination of NAICS 71 and NAICS 72) is projected to grow by a total of 91,591 jobs or 35.8 growth. Among the major industry sectors, Accommodation and Food services (NAICS 72) ranks first in projected growth. Arts, entertainment, and recreation ranks tenth out of 23 major industry sectors.

In more specific industry sectors (3 digit NAICS code), Accommodation (NAICS 721) ranks first in projected job growth at just over 57,000 jobs with Food Services and Drinking Places (NAICS 722) ranking second at 26,780 jobs. As for the sub-industries of Arts, entertainment, and recreation, they are all projected to grow but at relatively lower rates. Performing arts (NAICS 711) is projected to grow by nearly 3000 jobs or 67 percent, Museums and Historical Sites to grow by 300 jobs or 44.2 percent, and Amusement/Gambling to grow by nearly 4,300 jobs or 20.9 percent.

### **Projected Growth in Smaller Areas**

As expected, most of the projected growth is going to occur in the Las Vegas Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA). 84,098 of the 91,591 (91.8 percent) in the industry are to come from this area alone. However, all four substate areas are predicted to see growth over the decade but with all but Arts, entertainment, and recreation (NAICS 71) in Las Vegas falling below prepandemic levels.


### **Occupational Growth in Leisure and Hospitality**

The fastest growing occupations within the Leisure and Hospitality industry (in absolute terms) are cooks, waiters and waitresses, and fast food and counter workers.

For the year 2021, the average annual hourly wage across all industries and occupations in the Silver State was \$24.56<sup>1</sup>. The annual salary was \$51,080. Amongst the 51 states (District of Columbia included), Nevada ranks 37th in average hourly wage and annual salary.

The following occupations are the most common in the Leisure and Hospitality industry. The table below shows the average annual salary and average hourly wage for these occupations. This industry while vital to Nevada's economy has seen some relatively low wages. If the occupations below were compared against a list of all 603 unique occupations in the state, they would rank between 338th and 493rd in terms of average hourly wage.

### **Conclusion**

Nevada has long been a state with a vital, thriving, and important Leisure and Hospitality sector. During the Covid-19 pandemic, this sector saw the greatest declines amongst major industry sectors. As the economy nationwide and in Nevada have recovered, this sector is projected to recover most of its lost employment. This sector reached a peak in employment for the year, 2019, with 355,100 jobs statewide<sup>2</sup>. By the end of 2020, this number had decreased to 255,603. This was a decrease of 99,500 jobs or 28 percent over the year. Leisure and Hospitality is projected to reach an employment level of roughly 347,200 jobs in 2030. This would not represent a full recovery.

This industry is projected to be the fastest growing among the major industries over the period, 2020 to 2030. With a projected growth of 91,591 jobs or 35.8 percent over the ten years, the growth is quite sizable. This compares to all industries which are to grow by 268,632 jobs or 19.7 percent. The share of total employment attributed to Leisure and Hospitality is to be 21.2 percent. This is an improvement over 2020 when that share was 18.7 percent. However, this is far lower than the average from 2015 to 2019 of 29.7 percent. Based on these projections, over the coming decade, the leisure and hospitality industry will remain an important but smaller piece of Nevada's Economy.
